Marking System/Honor Roll

All courses excluding Physical Education are used in determining class rank and Honor Roll. Parish Hill utilizes a 4.0 scale to determine the academic honor roll. High Honor Roll is earned with a quarterly GPA of 3.6 or better (not weighted). Honor Roll is earned with a quarterly GPA of 3.0 - 3.59 (not weighted).

Class Rank

Class rank is determined through a weighting system whose values are given below in the Course Offerings section. An A+ in a heterogeneous course is equal to a 4.3 on a 4.0 scale. An A+ in an honors course is equal to a 4.8 on a 4.0 scale. An A+ in an AP/Honors UCONN Coop course is equal to a 5.3 on a 4.0 scale. The sum of the weighted grades is then divided by the sum of the attempted credits to arrive at class rank. Class rank is recalculated at the end of the year.

Enrichment Opportunities

Talented students in academics, music, theater, dance, creative writing and visual arts are afforded the opportunity to attend summer enrichment programs.

Sports

All sports are offered at the Junior Varsity and Varsity levels. Parish Hill offers participation in Soccer, Basketball, Cheerleading, Cross-Country, Track and Field, Bowling, Softball, Golf and Baseball.
