

FARMERS TO FAMILIES

The USDA Farmers to Families Food Box Program is a project funded through the Families First Coronavirus Relief act in which the USDA contracts with regional distributors to purchase products from U.S. farmers and distribute pre-packed food boxes to food insecure individuals through local organizations.

The Town of Chaplin will receive **400 boxes** from Vincent Farms in Delaware **next Wednesday October 28th**. Volunteers will be handing out prepackaged boxes of fresh food for anyone in need. You do NOT have to be a resident of Chaplin; this is open to surrounding towns as well as Chaplin residents. Each box will contain 5 pounds of meat, 5 pounds of dairy, 12 pounds of produce, and a gallon of milk.

We will be distributing the food boxes at the **Chaplin Fire House, #106 Phoenixville Rd. (Rt 198), Chaplin between the hours of 10:30 AM till 1 pm as long as supplies last. This is a first come first serve program.** If you are unable to come during those hours and there is food left you may contact Pastor Roger Bolduk at 860-455-9708 or text to 860-634-7158 or you can email him at pastorbolduk@gmail.com.

When you arrive at the Chaplin Fire House please enter the parking lot at the front of the building on the Rt 198 entrance and follow the traffic cones. Do not leave your vehicle and wear a face mask, volunteers will bring your food box to your vehicle and place it in your trunk or back seat. Then you will exit the Fire House from the rear driveway onto Cross Rd.
