Credit requirements for graduation are 25 total credits which include the following areas:

Class Rank/Marking System

All courses, excluding Physical Education, are used in determining class rank. Class rank is determined through a weighting system whose values are given below in the Course Offerings section. An A+ in a heterogeneous course is equal to a 4.3 on a 4.0 scale. An A+ in an honors course is equal to a 4.8 on a 4.0 scale. An A+ in an AP/UCONN ECE course is equal to a 5.3 on a 4.0 scale. The sum of the weighted grades is then divided by the sum of the attempted credits to arrive at class rank. Class rank is recalculated at the end of the year.

Sports

All sports are offered at the Junior Varsity and Varsity levels. Parish Hill offers participation in Soccer, Basketball, Cross-Country, Track and Field, Bowling, Rifle, Softball, Golf and Baseball. Students may also pursue various sports such as gymnastics, swimming, and wrestling through association with other area schools.

Business/Computer Science

Performing Arts

Senior Capstone

All seniors are required to complete a Senior Capstone project; which includes a research paper, project, panel presentation, and “fair” presentation.

Special Education

Heterogeneous = courses follow mainstream curriculum

Technology Education

Heterogeneous = Pre-Engineering Robotics, Adv. Robotics, Intro. To Construction Technology, Adv. Construction Tech, Computer Aided Design, Computer Aided Drafting 2.

Visual Arts

AP = AP Studio Art, AP Three Dimensional Art, AP Two Dimensional Art

Heterogeneous = Drawing & Painting, Foundations of Art, Foundations of Art 2, 2-D Art, Ceramics/Sculpture-3-D Art, Photography, Stained Glass, Studio Art, Senior Art Seminar, Video Communication & Production

College Partnerships

Quinebaug Valley Community College - Students may earn college credit in the College Partnership Program.

Eastern Connecticut State University - A student may take courses at ECSU at no cost through the WHIP Program.

University of Connecticut - Parish Hill follows the curriculum of the University of Connecticut in Spanish 5, which upon successful completion grants University of Connecticut Early College Experience college credit
